A gentleman at a library event explained that it was beneficial to have your own chickens and they could do so by getting a permit from the board of health. Our code book #136-25 states "No person shall keep or maintain any live animals or live poultry within the Borough."

NEW BUSINESS

The Health Department, in conjunction with Medical Laboratory Diagnostics, will be offering a Health Screen III Blood Profile on September 26th from 7 to 9am. The fee is \$20 plus other add on tests are available at the time of screening.

The Flu Clinic has a tentative date of October 31st.



Hesperides Organica, a flourishing organic farm, in Warwick, NJ has been bringing in fresh produce to give to residents who use our food pantry. They also operate rental kitchens on Florence and Utter Avenues. Over the past weeks, they have brought in potatoes, tomatoes, corn, parsley, onions, garlic, broccoli, cauliflower, beets, peppers, squash, lettuce, eggplant, kale, radishes, chard, carrots, celery, pears, peaches, apples and celery. The recipients have been very happy to have the fresh produce.

The Flaming Grill, located on Wagaraw Road where the CVS used to be, has opened a buffet which seems to be well received by the borough residents as well as neighboring towns.

Premio Foods, on Utter Avenue, has had a number of deliveries at lunch time for the employees. Jean is making sure they have licenses, in Hawthorne, to sell the food. They must show proof of the food being made in a satisfactory licensed store or restaurant.

There being no other business to come before the board, at this time, a motion was made by Tom Saraffian, seconded by Frank Kabrel, Jr. to adjourn the meeting. All were in favor. The next meeting will be held on November 20th.
