Adequate notice of the meeting has been provided by the annual schedule of regular meetings, heretofore adopted, and posted on the Public Bulletin Board at the Municipal Building, mailed to the Hawthorne Press and all persons who have requested the mailing of such schedule and a copy remained on file in the office of the Borough Clerk from December 15, 2014.

### Old Business

A motion was made by Viola Sweeney to accept the minutes of the March 12<sup>th</sup> meeting. The motion was seconded by Helen Pasquale and all were in favor.

"Spring Into Health Fair" was held on March 21<sup>st</sup> at the Louis Bay II Library from 11am to 2pm. Jayne Bosgra, Helen Pasquale, Winnie Kelly, Mary Beth Wetzelberger, and Carol Chamberlin were on hand to offer assistance and handed out Hawthorne Health Department information and brochures. Health Officer, Paul Persaud provided a mobile unit for HIV testing from Paterson. Overall, the fair was a success.

The annual Rabies Clinic was held on May 12<sup>th</sup> at the Ambulance Building from 6 to 8pm. Dr. Mary Clinton was the veterinarian from the Hawthorne Animal Hospital. 190 animals were vaccinated—175 dogs and 15 cats.

### New Business

Paterson may be getting the Flu Vaccines in August. As soon as we know the vaccine has arrived, a date will be selected probably in September or October. In addition to the regular vaccines, Flu Mist has been added. Mary Beth will select the date.

A blood drawing is usually held in September for a \$20 fee with additional tests being available to those participating. A date will be selected with the lab. Many residents as well as out of town people usually sign up because it is reasonable.



Winnie asked Jean Mugulusi about Hawthorne Pool inspections and Jean inspects the pool weekly and keeps track of the water reports that come from the water testing company. Eatmor Supermarket at 66 Goffle Road is out of business as is Mama Mia's on Lincoln Avenue. Artisan Bar and Grill has opened at 142 Goffle Road and a new cupcake bakery is scheduled for Lafayette Avenue, near Genevieve Avenue. Jean reported that there has been a problem with Brigantine Seafood, on Lincoln Avenue. The business owner is using a dumpster, located across the street, which belongs to the property owner. He must have his own dumpster on the property where Brigantine is located. He was advised to obtain one. Flo's Market is running the concession stand at the Hawthorne Pool for this season. There being no other business to come before the board, at this time, a motion was made by Viola Sweeney and seconded by Winnie Kelly to adjourn the meeting. All were in favor. The next meeting will be held on September 17<sup>th</sup>.
