

## INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

- At the first sound of thunder or sight of lightning, the pool will be cleared of patrons immediately by the lifeguard staff blowing one long blast of the whistle. The pool enclosure will be evacuated in an orderly and timely manner and the pool will remain closed for a full 30 minutes after the last sound of thunder.
- When the outside temperature is below 65 degrees for more than 1 hour, the clouds look to be lingering, and less than approximately 5% of the membership is using the pool, the pool manager has the option to close the pool. A sign indicating pool closure must be posted on the front gate (the sign explains that the pool will reopen if the temperature exceeds 65 degrees) and a message informing the public of the pool closure will be left on the pool's answering machine. Two lifeguards one office staff and one gate guard will remain "on call" for the remainder of their shift. If these weather conditions persist, the pool manager or someone the manager designates will notify the oncoming pool staff of the pool closure. If the temperature exceeds 65 degrees the staff members will be required to return to and re open the pool within the hour.
- When the temperature is 65 degrees or below upon opening of the pool, the pool manager will arrive before their shift and post a sign (and leave a message on the pool's answering machine) indicating pool closure for weather. Two lifeguards one office staff and one gate guard will remain "on call" for the remainder of their shift. If these weather conditions persist, the pool manager or someone the manager designates will notify the oncoming pool staff of the pool closure. *If members are at the facility planning to swim upon opening, the pool manager is required to adequately staff and open the pool.*
