Confidential HIV counseling and testing, in Spanish and English. Rapid testing available. Clinic hours between 9:00am to 3:00pm Monday thru Friday



CLINICS ARE BY APPOINTMENT ONLY

Well Baby Clinic Ext. 2740

Physicals, screenings and immunizations for well children and newborns to 4 years of age by appointment.

Childhood immunization clinic Ext. 2740

Children 4 years of age through completion of high school, Tuesday and Thursday 12:30pm.-2:30 pm

Maternal and Child Health Ext. 2708

Upon referral, health education and public health nurse follow-up are provided to pregnant women before and after the baby's birth.

Childhood Lead Poison Control Program Ext. 2399

Every 1st, 2nd and 3rd Wednesday of every month 8:30am to 10:30am

Lead poisoning is a serious disease which can cause anemia, irritability, seizures, learning disabilities, cognitive impairment, paralysis and coma. All children ages 6 mos. To six years old must be screened for lead poisoning

Free testing for all uninsured children

Podiatry Clinic Ext. 2740

Providing services to Senior Citizens and others with circulatory problems and diabetes on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of every month. Included are blood pressure screenings, foot health services and referrals.

Adult Health Ext. 2379

- Blood pressure and/or total cholesterol measurement and referral
- Glucose (blood sugar) measurements
- Cardiovascular Disease Education
- Pneumonia vaccination throughout the year

Health Education Ext. 2715
