There are only 67 dogs that have not renewed for 2016. Letters were sent by the board of health and Tyco also called the owners to renew. After Tyco's call, many residents responded and renewed the licenses. The remaining dogs will be sent a summons by Tyco.

At the last board meeting there was a concern regarding the Leash Law and picking up after dogs and since that time our cable TV channel has broadcasted this information to the public.

### New Business

The Annual Rabies Clinic was held on May 10<sup>th</sup> at the Ambulance Garage on Goffle Road from 6 to 8 pm. At the last minute Hawthorne Animal Hospital decided not to administer the vaccines but fortunately the North Haledon Veterinarian, Dr. Carolyn Schnek, accepted the offer. The clinic did run a little longer than usual, but worked out well. 170 pets were immunized, 12 cats and 158 dogs.

St. Anthony's Fair was held last weekend and was very successful.

Anyone cooking and handling food at Hawthorne Day in September is required to attend Jean Mugulusi's class.
