### OLD BUSINESS

A motion was made by Lucy Pataki to accept the minutes of the September 15<sup>th</sup> meeting and seconded by Helen Pasquale. All were in favor.

Blood drawing was held on September 28<sup>th</sup> in the courtroom with approximately 50 clients in attendance. Four of the clients had inconclusive results and had the choice of going to the lab for more blood work or getting their money back. Mary Beth polled the clients as to their feelings about the blood drawing and overwhelmingly they thought it was a good community service and hoped to see it continue. Winnifred Kelly would like to how many clients attended the previous two years, for a comparison. Records will be checked before the next meeting.

The annual Flu Clinic was held on November 9<sup>th</sup> from 9am to 1pm. Dr. Lozito sent an assistant to help Mary Beth administer the vaccine. About 115 attended and the vaccine is still being offered by Mary Beth when she is in the office. Many residents now go to their own physician or drugstores as it is free to those on Medicare. Sign ups and registration was done in advance so the clinic ran smoothly.

### NEW BUSINESS


The Dtap vaccine was made available to workers that participated in work during Hurricane Irene such as DPW workers, ambulance, and police personnel. 125 vaccines

were ordered but between 25 and 30 showed for the immunization. The borough nurse is making them available, to those interested, during her working hours.

Dunkin Donuts has opened another shop at 84 Goffle Road. The Granada Restaurant has not re-opened since the flooding. There will be a new candy store located on Warburton Avenue, near the train tracks. It will be called the Chocolate Box and hopes to be open before the Christmas Season.

**Public Health Nursing Report**

November 2011

The school nurses/teachers/school employees of Hawthorne have been provided notice that the Tdap and seasonal flu vaccine are available for them free of charge through the public health nurse. I visited the Jefferson School nurse to bring CDC information and see if I could be of assistance.

Since the flu clinic of November 9, 2011, a total of 141 injections have been given. Paterson is requiring all paper work to be returned by December 31, 2011

There are available 59 free Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis) through the public health nurse. At present, due to the over supply, on-hand, the Tdap has been extended to the Hawthorne teachers and staff, borough employee's and their adult dependants. A second notice of the availability of these immunizations has been e-mailed to Mr. Mooney's Office and to all his staff.

The County of Passaic has informed Hawthorne a child with elevated blood lead level has moved into the borough.

I visited Van Dyke Park Place for a diabetic program presented by Valley Hospital Community Education Department. The educator stated the program was open to all the local residents.
