OLD BUSINESS

Vic Terraglia, Jr. made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 16, 2023 meeting. It was seconded by Helen Pasquale and all were in favor.

The annual rabies clinic was held in the Hawthorne Pool parking lot on May 9th from 6 to 8PM. 107 dogs and 13 cats were administered the rabies vaccine by Dr. Joseph De Santo. Tyco Animal Control were also there to help. Traffic Lt. Mark Michalski kept the traffic moving smoothly and everyone was pleased with the clinic being held there. Joe Wojtecki was also able to provide assistance.

NEW BUSINESS

Mike Firrincili has chose not to serve another term on the Board of Health. He has served faithfully for many years and is stepping down. He will be missed by all.

So far this year 688 dogs have been licensed and 16 cats.

The F1rst Restaurant on Lincoln Ave. and D'Carbone Restaurant on Goffle Road have both received licenses to open and will be open in the near future.

On June 30th the last of free marriage licenses will end. So far 111 free applications have been taken.

A marriage application is \$28.00 and we keep the \$3 and the state gets \$25. We will be reimbursed for our portion.

Our food pantry has served: March 7 families, 32 individuals; April 8 families, 30 individuals and May 7 families, 28 individuals. We continually receive food donations from our residents.

The Hawthorne pool has opened, for the season, weekends and when school is out the pool is open daily.

A few discussions took place among the members. Jean Mugulusi told us of a lead case on Rock Road where the home was abated for the sum of \$56,000 and it was paid for by the state through Paterson. The family was put in a hotel while the house was being redone. Vic Terraglia told of an incident involving a deer being shot and he had to call in the proper authorities to take care of it. Sherrine told us of her involvement with flavored vaping, which is illegal. Young adults can be enticed which is what they want to prevent. Sherrine also had a problem at one of our restaurants which Jean will look into. We all enjoyed the discussions.

There being no further business, to come before the board, a motion was made by Vic and seconded by Chris to adjourn the meeting. All were in favor. Our next meeting will be held on September 21st.
