- III. Hawthorne Water Reports May to August 2021 reports was reviewed and discussed. All water results are fine, except for PFOA and PFOS. Hawthorne has been diligently and proactive by working on how to address PFOA and PFOS in the water; PFOA/PFOS Drinking Water Maximum Contaminant Level effective January 1, 2021; NJDEP Compliance 4 quarters of data and take a running annual average for the year; NJDEP has been issuing notice of violations to water suppliers as early as 2nd and 3rd quarter preempting the 4 quarters of data for an average for each PFOA and PFOS; Recently, Hawthorne received notice from NJDEP and will issue a letter to all customers notifying them. At the recent Council meeting, September 1, 2021, Hawthorne awarded Boswell design contract for the PFOA/PFOS treatment system;

- IX. 8 Acre Woods Project (Project) Discussion Partnership with the Borough of Hawthorne, Hawthorne Shade Tree Commission, Downes Tree Service and the Hawthorne Environmental Commission The Environmental Commission, lead of the Project, has been working with the Shade Tree Commission, Town Arborist, and Downes Tree Service to evaluate and assess the 8 Acre Woods area.
 - a. **Goals:** Preserve the natural habitat; keeping the secret places for the animals dead wood/trees will remain on the ground/woods; keeping the bushes/berries along the trails only pruning back the bushes; cut the bottom of the invasive plants and vines on the trees along the trails this will stop the continue flow of water and nutrients resulting in the vines/plants will die and drop to the ground; will allow the existing trees to breathe
 - b. **Trail Signs** Rayna will provide the number of trail signs; Total of 15 signs ((1) Warbler Way, (2) Migrant Meadows, (2) Vireo Vista, (1) Catbird Circle, (2) Oriole View, (1) Llewellyn Lane, (2) Towhee Trail, (2) Grosbeak Grove, (1) Finch Fairway, and (1) Robin Road) that we need to purchase to Rosanne. Rosanne will contact Vacker Signs for Trails and Parks, who purchased our Rain Garden Sign for the Gateway to the Passaic River project; Next Step: Carol,
