



Construction of upgrades and improvements to Hawthorne Water Departments (HWD) North Station, South Station, Goffle Hill, and Utter Ave water treatment facilities were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJIB) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the NJIB to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will benefit the community by upgrading the existing water treatment at these facilities to comply with the NJDEP's newly set limits on PFOA and PFOS in drinking water. These upgrades will allow the HWD to continue to deliver safe drinking water to all residents in the departments service area.

State Revolving Fund programs around the nation provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure protecting our valuable water resources nationwide.
